8	In Year 8 in 2016-2017, 78.7% of FSM6 English pupils made expected progress or better – 9.9% less when compared to their non-FSM6 colleagues. Intervention groups are in place to work with FSM6 pupils who fall behind in English. We are also introducing the Lexia reading programme to support underachieving FSM6 pupils in English. In maths, by the end of Yr 8, 82.7% of FSM6 pupils were making expected progress or better, compared to 81.9% of non-FSM6 pupils. Again, intervention groups are in place to work with FSM6 pupils who fall behind in maths. Overall, a greater % of FSM6 pupils were making expected progress or better than non-FSM6 pupils in maths, Science, Geography, History and Music. Across all subjects, 89.2% of FSM6 pupils were making expected progress or better, compared to 89.7% for non-FSM pupils – a gap just of 0.5%.
