


Vaping


Definition:

Vaping is the act of inhaling and exhaling vapor.




'Vaping' is the term used for inhaling vapor through an E-Cigarette or other electronic vaping devices. The device operates by heating a pod of liquid that turns into vapor. This liquid usually comes in appealing flavours such as chocolate, strawberry and bubblegum to name a few.

Nicotine and addiction

Nicotine is
extremely
addictive.
Withdrawal
symptoms
include
headaches,
restlessness, low
mood and feeling
irritated.

Nicotine increases blood pressure and heart rate.

"Vaping is highly addictive because it usually contains Nicotine."

Nicotine narrows arteries.

Nicotine can lead to heart attacks.

People become addicted to nicotine because it increases the levels of dopamine (reward hormones) produced in the body.

Another reason people vape is because the **nicotine** temporarily relieves the feeling of stress and anxiety.

Ewan developed a condition called hypersensitivity pneumonitis - something he was breathing in was setting off his immune system, with catastrophic consequences.

It was six months before he was properly up and on his feet again.

"I'm still not back to normal, I'd say 75-80%, it's in the last six months that I'm feeling a bit stronger in myself," he said.

"Vaping has basically ruined me, I try to tell everyone and they think I'm being stupid, I tell my mates and they don't listen.

"They still do it... but they've seen what I've been through.

"Is it worth risking your life for smoking e-cigs?

Student: "It's my body and I'm not hurting anyone else by vaping."

"Many young people unfortunately believe that the "vape cloud" disappears quickly and so does not harm others but research has shown that the aerosol that users inhale will expose not only themselves but also innocent bystanders to the harmful substances contained. This is bad especially if they are near others who are asthmatic as they will be negatively impacting these people, even if it is not intentional."

UK law on vaping

- you must be 18 or over to buy e-cigarettes or eliquids
- Illegal for vape retailer sells vapes, e-cigarettes or e-liquids to a minor (under 18 years), (£2500 fine)
- Illegal for vape adverts to include models who appear to be under the age of 25
 - An adult is forbidden to buy a vape for a minor.
