Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Hot Weather Arrangements – Week Commencing 22 June 2026

With forecast high temperatures this week, we have put in place a number of adaptations to help ensure that all pupils remain safe, comfortable, and able to learn effectively.

Uniform

Pupils may remove their tie, undo their top button, and shirts do not have to be tucked in. Pupils may wear trousers, skirts, or tailored shorts (skirts and shorts must be no shorter than just above the knee).

We strongly encourage pupils not to wear jumpers, blazers, underlayers, or coats during this period of hot weather.

Break and Lunch Arrangements

The air-conditioned hall will be open for breaktimes and when possible around the exams during lunch times to provide a cool space:

Lunch opening times:

- Today: 1:45–2:10pm
- Rest of the week: 1:30–2:00pm

Water and Hydration

Pupils are encouraged to bring sufficient water for the day. We recommend bringing two bottles—freezing one overnight can help keep it cool.

There are two refill points available in school:

- The water cooler by the hall (not available during exams)
- The water point in reception

Free drinking water is also available from the canteen at break and lunch times.

Please note:

- Bottles should only be refilled before/after school, and during break or lunchtimes.
- The tray at the refill stations does not drain and must not be used to empty bottles.
- **Water fights are strictly not permitted.** Water must be used for drinking only.

General Health

If your child has a medical condition such as asthma that may be affected by hot weather, please ensure they bring any required medication to school (for example, inhalers).

We recommend that pupils apply sun cream before school and bring some to reapply if they will be outside.

PE Lessons

Our PE staff will closely monitor conditions and adapt lessons accordingly, always prioritising pupil safety.

School Building Measures

To help manage temperatures, we are:

- Keeping external electric doors open where possible to improve airflow
- Ensuring blinds remain down in classrooms where available
- Opening windows early in the day
- Monitoring classroom temperatures throughout the week

We appreciate your support in ensuring pupils are prepared for the heat and remain safe and comfortable during this period. We will continue to monitor as the week progresses and will be in touch with any updates.
